

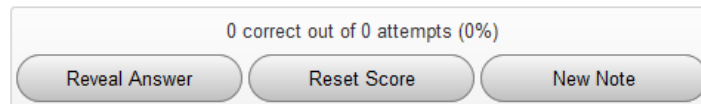
## CALAMITY DAY LESSON #2

### *High School Choir*

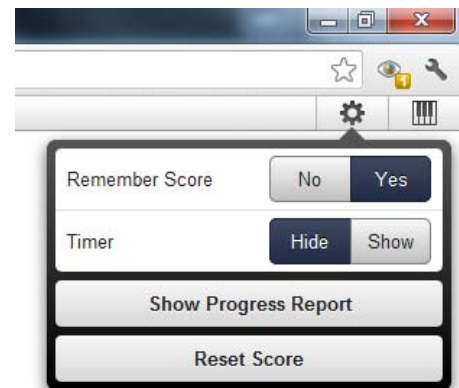
#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

You will be asked to identify 25 different notes and 25 different solfege syllables. After you complete the task, you will be printing off a copy of how you did. If at any time you are unhappy with your score and would like to try again, you can simply reset the score by clicking on “Reset Score” and then start over with the questions.



After completing each set of 25 exercises (notes and solfege syllables) with the score you would like to submit, please click on the little gear wheel in the upper right hand corner in the toolbar and then click “Show Progress Report”.
